#### **How to Create your FSA ID**

Your FSA ID is a username and password required for both students and guardians to be able to sign and complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

To begin filling out the FAFSA you will need to create your FSA ID at least 1 week prior.

- A verified email is required to establish your account- Both guardians and students need to create their own separate accounts that do not share the same email address as only one email is allowed per FSA ID.
- You will be asked to fill out the Personal Identification Information to verify your FSA ID, it is important to make sure your Social Security or ITIN (individual tax identification number), date of birth, and name match what's on your Social Security card or ITIN. Identity match is required for each student and guardian to verify their FSA ID.

Please keep your account information in a safe place as you'll use your FSA ID every year you fill out a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form and for the lifetime of your federal student loans.



## **What are Testing Accommodations?**



Accommodations may modify the test timing, setting, or materials that may be used during testing.

Some examples are: Extended Time, Large Print Test Booklets, Assistive Technology such as Screen Readers or Text to Speech software and many more.



To be eligible for accommodations on standardized tests such as the SAT need for the accommodation must be provided with the request.
